



BYOD 2024

Over the past few weeks, we have been seeking feedback from the community, local high school, students and staff about the BYOD program at Gymea Bay Public School.

Based on feedback a decision has been made that we will not be having BYOD in Year 3 next year. The students will be provided with access to technology including ipads and computers/laptops through school resources.

Over the next three years, we will be phasing out BYOD iPads and introducing laptops for our Year 5 and 6 students only.


















































K-2 Talent Quest

Our students have been involved in Transition to Year 1 activities. On Monday, KW visited the iW class and had lots of questions about what it will be like to be in Year 1.








KP visited 1Z and worked together to create posters, discussing and writing about all the things that will be the same and different in Year 1!














Blue

Red smalls like the smoke of a burning fire.


Bed tooks like an apple as hard as stone

Bed tastes like a sweet strawberry, the flavour hubbling in your mouth


