


Writing Highlight! Kayan (K/1J) showing some incredible creative skills in his writing this week!

Lots of collaboration and concentration was in evidence as well as frustration as Stage 2 students attempted to build a structure from playing cards.













Kiss and Drop Zone

If you use the Kiss and Drop zone, thank you for following the road rules.

The Kiss and Drop Zone located on Gymea Bay Road (past gate 3) is for your convenience and for your child's safety. Designed for quick entry and exit, it minimises congestion and risk when used properly by all parents.

- The Kiss and Drop Zone operates under 'No Parking' traffic rules.
- Stopping for more than 2 minutes is not allowed in a No Parking area. Therefore the Kiss and Drop Zone cannot be used for parking between 8am-9.30am and 2.30pm-4pm on school days.
- You are obliged to remain in, or within 3 metres of your vehicle.
- If you are waiting for your child, please move forward to allow other vehicles to enter the zone.

Sutherland Council Rangers, Parking Officers and the Police enforce these rules and issue penalties, so always use the zone correctly to avoid fines.
